There is a \$25.00 fee per lesson. Lessons are limited to one time per week. Campers will not be scheduled during instructional swim and lunch. Lessons may be scheduled any other period or activity during the day. Each lesson will be scheduled for the same time each week for consistency. Every effort will be made to make up lessons that were missed due to rain or absentee. Refunds for lessons will only be given if a lesson is missed because of rain and cannot be rescheduled. Refunds are not provided if a camper is unprepared or decides to skip a lesson. Campers will receive their riding schedule for the entire season one week before camp begins.

All riders must be prepared for the lesson and arrive on time. Riders must wear long pants (leggings work great!), boots with a heel and either a bicycle or riding helmet. This mandatory equipment is for the safety of the rider!

The goal of the program is to introduce campers to the pleasures of working with horses and ponies. Please keep in mind that a brief portion of the first lesson may be unmounted in order to teach some essential riding skills. We hope that each camper will be happy and comfortable while developing an enjoyment of horses and ponies.
